Eastside was named one of 30 newspapers nationwide (out of over 1,000) to receive the distinction of First Place with Special Merit by the American Scholastic Press Association. The newspaper was also one of ten to receive an award for best editorial. The editorial, which ran in the November issue, was orchestrated by Zack Rosenblatt ('09), who was assisted by the rest of the *Eastside* Editorial Board.

Cherry Hill East Vocal Music

The Cherry Hill East Vocal Ensemble has been selected to perform at the Opening General Session of the NJSBA/NJASA/NJASBO Annual Workshop (NJ) School Boards Association/NJ Association of School Administrators/NJ Association of School Business Officials). The East students will perform on Wednesday, October 28, in Atlantic City.

Period-by-Period Attendance

New computers have been installed at East through the Evergreen Program. As a result of this new technology, we will be able to move forward with an attendance system which provides period-by-period attendance for all students for all students. Since the beginning of school, staff members have been trained in the use of this system, and it has been used successfully. This means that students and teachers are accountable for attendance period-by-period, and as we move throughout the year, we will be developing archival attendance records. Such a record will enable us to evaluate student attendance and provide accountability.

Flu Precautions: Keeping Our Kids Healthy and Preventing the Spread of H1N1

Flu can spread easily from person to person; therefore, we are taking proactive steps to prevent the spread of flu in our schools. We want to keep our schools open and functioning in a normal manner, but we need your help to do this.

Basic hygiene practices are the key to preventing the spread of H1N1 or any illness. We ask your cooperation with the following:

- **Teach your children to wash their hands** frequently with soap and water for at least 20 seconds...about the time it takes to sing "Happy Birthday" twice. Hand cleaners containing at least 60% alcohol are also effective.
- **Teach your children not to share personal items** like drinks, food, or unwashed utensils.
- **Teach your children to cover their coughs and sneezes** with tissues. If tissues are unavailable, use the elbow, arm, or sleeve instead of the hand.
- **Know the signs and symptoms of the flu.** Symptoms include fever (100 degrees Fahrenheit, 37.8 degrees Celsius or greater), cough, sore throat, a runny or stuffy nose, body aches, headache, and fatigue. Some people may also vomit or have diarrhea.
- **Do not send children to school if they are sick.** Our staff will be closely monitoring student health and sick children will be sent home.
- **Keep sick children at home** for at least 24 hours after the cessation of symptoms or the absence of a fever without the use fever-reducing medications.

Please be sure to return your updated emergency contact information. This will enable us to reach you if your child becomes sick at school. The CDC also recommends that parents and guardians develop contingency plans to provide child care at home for a minimum of five school days if their child is sick or their school is dismissed.

If we experience severe flu conditions in the district, we may take additional steps to prevent the spread of flu. We will use our website and other means to notify parents of any changes in strategy. We will also use our website to provide updated information if an H1N1 flu vaccination program is implemented.

COLUMBIA TEEN SCREEN

Did you know that depression and anxiety affect as many as one out of five teens today and that 17% of US high school students report serious thoughts of suicide? Unfortunately, most teens with these problems never get identified. We at Cherry Hill Public Schools think this is an important issue and that no student should have to suffer in silence when help is readily available. As a result, we are now partnering with the Columbia University TeenScreen Program to make free and voluntary emotional health screening available to our student body. Cherry Hill Public School's Mental Health Initiative mission is to work to help parents better understand the changes their children are experiencing and know when to seek help for their teens.

In most cases, screening can reassure parents that their children are just experiencing typical adolescent "growing pains." For others, the TeenScreen Program can help parents find a problem early enough to prevent the development of long-term serious problems.

Please take advantage of this confidential and free screening. Look for your Teen Screen information in your back to school packet that is mailed directly to your home.
